SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

Are you interested in working toward social justice by contributing to quality STEM education for children in underserved communities? Loyola's Noyce CREST Scholars Program supports tuition, books, fees, and licensure exams for full-time one-year **Master of Arts in Teaching (MAT)** students by awarding funds ranging from approximately \$18,000 to \$22,000.

If you are looking to earn your graduate school counseling degree, you could receive a full scholarship thanks to the Loyola University Maryland School Counseling Scholarship Program: Culturally Responsive and Inclusive School-Counselor Preparation, or "CRISP." The CRISP Scholar award will cover full tuition for the **M.A. or M.Ed. in School Counseling degree** and provide an internship grant that totals \$20,000 (\$10,000 awarded each semester of internship).
